Hypothermia Risk Factors

- · dog breeds with short and/or thin coats
 - · small dogs
 - · elderly dogs
 - young puppies

- Aways prioritize the safety of the animal by
 monitoring or limiting activity. Go slow and be pateint!
- 2 Avoid ice, snow drifts, deep snow, and frozen water.
- Make sure the animal is dressed in winter gear (sweater, coat, booties, etc.) if available.

Early Signs of Hypothermia and What To Do

lack of alertness slow, shallow breakthing

reluctance/refusal to keep walking

weakness/lethargy low blood pressure

shivering (mild to severe) muscle stiffness

- Move the dog inside.
- Wipe paws to remove ice and/or ice melt.
- Warm up slowly using blankets or clothing.
